WESTBROOK PAPER CITY HOOPS
SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

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ARTICLE 1

CREATION AND OBJECTIVITY

Section 1 – This Scholarship Program, created in accordance with the terms hereof, shall be known as the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Scholarship Program and referenced as WPOCH within the boundaries of this document.

Section 2 – The creation of the scholarship program is a free act of the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Basketball Program and its Director, Lewis Lampron. The WPOCH retains the right to alter, suspend or cancel the Scholarship Program at any time without giving any reason, provided however, that scholarship winners already under the program receive the stipends awarded to them.

Section 3 – The scholarship is hereby created for the purpose of providing financial assistance to enhance the educational opportunities of a graduating student of Westbrook High School who participated in or has made significant contributions to the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Program.



ARTICLE 2

ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATION

Section 1 – Applicants must be a graduating senior at Westbrook High School who participated in the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Program or has made significant contributions to the program.

Section 2 – Applications are to be obtained from the Westbrook High School Guidance Department or the Westbrook Paper City Hoops website, www.papercityhoops.com. All required application forms are to be returned to the Westbrook High School Guidance Department to be eligible for consideration.

Section 3 – At the time of the application, applicant must be a Westbrook High School senior.

Section 4 – Applicants, along with their application, must submit records of academic achievement in high school and a letter of recommendation from a person in the academic field having knowledge of the applicant’s character and/or accomplishments. Applicants are required to submit a complete personal resume of their notable activities to date.

Section 5 – The Plan Year is the calendar year, January 1 through December 31. The Scholarship Award will be for the September College entrances for that calendar year.



ARTICLE 3

ADMINISTRATION

Section 1 – The WPCH is responsible for publicity of this Scholarship program and the distribution of the applications to Westbrook High School Guidance Department.

Section 2 – WPCH Director, Lewis Lampron will appoint a Scholarship Committee effective September of each year.

Section 3 – The WPCH Committee will consist of the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Basketball Program Director and a minimum of but limited to (3) members appointed by the director. The responsibility of the Committee will consist of:

- (a) Administrator of the scholarship program in accordance with the provisions herein.
- (b) Screening of all scholarship applicants and determination of the scholarship winner.

Section 4 – The WPCH Committee, at their discretion, determine the application period.

Section 5 – The WPCH Committee shall make uniform rules and regulations necessary for the administration of the scholarship program.

Section 6 – The WPCH Committee shall meet at least annually at a date selected by them, to review this scholarship program and its funds. At this time they will determine the application period involved and the date in April to screen all applications and determine award.



ARTICLE 4

AWARD

Section 1 – The scholarship stipend will be awarded by the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Basketball Scholarship Program.

Section 2 – One boy and one girl scholarship will be awarded each year with the amount of the stipend determined by the amount of funds available.

Section 3 – The Scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) will be awarded and payable to the school upon completion of the first Semester of continuing education in good academic standing.

Section 4 – A certificate of Scholarship indicating the amount of the stipend will be issued to the winner at the Westbrook High School Scholarship/Awards Ceremony.

Section 5 – Whereas this Scholarship Program has been created to provide financial assistance for continued and further education it will be awarded to applicants attending academic or technical institutions of higher learning.



ARTICLE 5

FUNDING

Section 1 – Effective October 1, 2010 the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Scholarship Committee will set aside the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the purpose of establishing the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Scholarship Program.

Section 2 – Each subsequent year the scholarship program is in effect, the WPCH Travel Basketball Scholarship Committee will review the financial status to determine the award for that year.

Section 3 – In the event the funds are not available, The Westbrook Paper City Hoops Scholarship Committee can determine but are not obligated to execute other means and methods to subsidize this scholarship program through other fund-raising projects.



ARTICLE 6

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Read these instructions carefully before you submit your application. All applicants are judged equally on all parts of the application. Be sure to return a complete application. Incomplete applications could result in disqualification. The instruction and checklist are for reference only. Do not submit it with your application.

INSTRUCTIONS & CHECKLIST – Complete the following, check them off to ensure you have met all the requirements. An online version of the application can be found at www.papercityhoops.com.

 PART I – Applicant Information: To be filled out by applicant. If you have been accepted by a school/college, be sure a copy of the verification is included.

 PART II – Letter of Recommendation: Please provide a letter of recommendation from an adult. The adult can be a mentor, coach, club advisor, faculty member, etc. The person you select should have knowledge of your character, integrity, and personal qualities. Include the Letter of Recommendation when you submit your application. If you select a faculty member, you will need to select a different faculty member to complete part IV – Faculty Recommendation.

 PART III – Essay: This is an essay on how Westbrook Paper City Hoops & other youth organizations have influenced you. Put some thought into this, it is an important part of the selection process.

 PART IV – Faculty Recommendation: Please complete your personal information then submit the form to a faculty member for completion. If you selected a faculty member for the Letter of Recommendation, do not submit the application to the same faculty member. You must ensure that it is returned to you and submitted with the rest of the application.

 PART V – Application Submittal: Please submit the application in a sealed envelope. Attach a copy of the front page of the application (with your name on it) to the envelope.

SUBMIT TO THE WESTBOORK HIGH SCHOOL GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT NO LATER THAN APRIL 1ST OF THAT YEAR.

Please submit the application in a sealed envelope. Attach a copy of the front page of the application (with your name on it) to the envelope. Only the Westbrook Paper City Hoops Committee will review the applications, the Westbrook High School Guidance Department will not review any applications. All applications will be reviewed after the April 1st submittal date.

Failure to submit the application by this date could result in immediate disqualification.

The scholarship will be awarded at the Westbrook High School Awards ceremony.

The award is contingent upon the Scholarship Committee receiving documentation of recipient's successful completion of the first semester of college.
